I am pleased to present the ICCCPO Annual Report 2009-2010. It has been another motivating and fruitful year with fast growing membership, as well as remarkable events, activities and achievements at all levels. All ICCCPO Executive Board Members and Advisors have been working enthusiastically to nurture the formation and growth of parent groups so as to narrow the gap between resource-rich and resource-limited countries for the improvement of childhood cancer treatment and care.

I am thrilled and proud to report that ICCCPO attained Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) of the United Nations in July 2010. This paves the way for ICCCPO to achieve international recognition. On 15th February 2010 International Childhood Cancer Day (ICCD), ICCCPO issued a joint statement with the International Union Against Cancer and World Child Cancer to promote awareness of childhood cancer. We shall keep working on international advocacy and hopefully one day ICCD will become an official date on the global cancer agendas.

Being the initiator of World Child Cancer, ICCCPO organised Global Fundraising 2010 for the first time to coincide with ICCD. Sixteen member organisations took part in the event and raised €12,000 to assist World Child Cancer programs in resource-limited countries. Much still needs to be done to deal with the inequality of childhood cancer treatment and care in resource-limited countries.

One of our focuses in the coming year will be to develop more regional representatives who are willing and able to assist with regional work in order to achieve this mission of ICCCPO and to support the continuity of ICCCPO.

To all our volunteers, ICCCPO members and committees, please accept my sincere gratitude for your high unwavering involvement and dedicated support. I look forward to your continuous cooperation in the future.

Together with all other participants at this 41st SIOP Conference, we experienced a high quality, well organised conference. This was made possible through the hard work of the local organising committee, all the speakers, chairs of sessions and of course our delegates. Special thanks to Anders Wollmén and Anita Kienesberger for organising the ICCCPO annual conference for the second time.

Annual General Assembly

At the AGA in Sao Paulo, Irina Ban from Serbia, and Benson Pau from Hong Kong SAR, China were re-elected onto the Executive Committee for another 3 year term. Val Figliuzzi from Canada was elected as a new member. We welcome Val as the representative for North America.

Regional Meetings & Activities Africa

In Africa, a focus area continues to be identifying and then contacting individuals, be they parents or sympathetic medical experts, from countries where full treatment or aspects of treatment for childhood cancer is offered at treatment centres, but where no parent group exists. To this end approaches have been made to a number of potential groups where practical assistance, motivation, support and insome cases visits have taken place to facilitate the formation of parent groups. Cooperation and contribution to the cause of children with cancer and ICCCPO.

Executive Committee Meeting

An ICCCPO EC meeting was held in Sao Paulo, Brazil, as usualjust prior to the annual conference in October 2009. The mid-year EC meeting was held in Belgrade, Serbia in March 2010 in conjunction with Serbia National Parent Group AGA. Not only was it a constructive meeting, but also a great opportunity to support the growth of the local parent groups.

Membership

At the Annual General Assembly in Sao Paolo, fifteen neworganisations were adopted as new members (seven as fullandeightasassociatemembers). Five of these are from new countries. We lost one member in Ireland which had been disbanded. This brings our membership to 132 member organisations from 78 countries.

networking opportunities have been established with World Child Cancer, UICC, AfrOx, Children in Crossfire and the LiveStrong Foundation to further the aims of ICCCPO in Africa.

Since October 2009, with Kenneth Dollman's effort, new parent groups have been established in Sierra Leone, Kenya and Uganda. Potential new groups could be established soon in Tanzania, Nigeria, Cameroon and Zambia. Another focus area is to establish successful twinning projects in Africa. Such projects are operational in a number of African countries. It is a sincere hope that such projects expand to include many more African countries where children with cancer can benefit.

A regional meeting of ICCCPO Africa was held in Akra, Ghana during March 2010. This was made possible through the expert organisation of Dr Lorna Renner and the local organising committee, supported by Mr Kwame Aveh.

Asia

The first China National Parent Groups meeting was held in July 2009 in Guangzhou with the support of ICCCPO. It was a great success. Parent groups, childhood cancer foundations and other medical professionals from nine main cities participated, despite the fact that the development of parent groups in China is still in its early stages.

In 2010, Benson Pau visited parent groups in the Philippines, Indonesia and Vietnam to support the growth of regional parent groups. Both local ICCCPO members in the Philippines and Indonesia arranged meetings with officers of health ministries. It was a good opportunity to raise awareness and advocate for childhood cancer at governmental level.

On behalf of ICCCPO, Benson Pau attended UICC's World Cancer Congress 2010 and World Cancer Leaders' Summit in Shenzhen, China in August 2010.

Europe

Organised by Gerlind Bode, Marianne Naafs-Wilstra and Anita Kienesberger, all European ICCCPO members were invited to the first information meeting on all EU sponsored projects in which ICCCPO is a partner. Unfortunately, this meeting which had been scheduled for a mid-April weekend was unexpectedly hampered by the cloud of volcanic ash from the Icelandic volcano. So, only those who could travel by train or car were able attend the meeting in Bonn, Germany. Representatives of the projects CHILDHOPE, EPOC and ELTEC informed the ICCCPO delegates about the aims and possibilities of these projects. A proposal for a new project titled ENNCA was introduced. During these presentations, delegates soon realized that research on the treatment and care of children with cancer has become much more international within the European context.

Communications & Information

Newsletter & Website

The new ICCCPO website is still under construction – unfortunately for quite a while already. As it is intended to change the newsletter into a fully digital version connected to the website, it was not possible to distribute any new edition of the newsletter during the past year.

The 5th Regional meeting of Childhood Cancer Parent Organisations from former Yugoslavia countries was held in Ljubljana, Republic Slovenia in June 2010, with the support of ICCCPO. The meeting was successfully organised by Irina Ban and Slovenian Childhood Cancer Parent Organisation (SLoDRS), with participation of parents, survivors and physicians from 5 countries and of great importance the presence of local authorities.

Latin America

Edith Grynszpancholc has made several visits to La Paz, Cochabambay Santa Cruz de la Sierr, Bolivia, where she met some new organisations and other individuals helping children with cancer. The idea in Latin America is to make allgroups work towards creating a national perspective to improve the outcomes of children with cancer in their countries.

In Santiago, Chile, she has been invited to talk about networking, during their Second National Meeting of CCF. She was also invited to give a talk about networking and improving quality of life in children with cancer in Tijuana, Mexico, during their National Haematology/ Oncology Meeting. Just before the ICCCPO annual conference in Sao Paulo, Brazil, she also organised a Latin-American Regional Meeting with the Society of Latin American Pediatric Oncology (SLAOP).

North America

As a new board member, Val Figliuzzi has attempted to connect with groups across North America to educate them as to the value of ICCCPO and encourage participation and membership. However, as it would appear that there is no reliable directory of parent groups, she has run into several challenges relating to the location of groups across the continent. As such she is in the process of identifying methods to reach these groups.

Along with her colleague in Ottawa, the National Coalition of Children's Cancer Agencies was created. Val hopes that this Canadian project will also serve as a vehicle to identify groups that will further the work of ICCCPO.

Parent Helping Parents Fund

The Parents Helping Parents Fund (PHPF) remains of great importance to support delegates from low income countries to attend the ICCCPO meetings. Through the PHPF member organisations turn ICCCPO's vision "We care, We share" into reality. We are extremely grateful to all those members who made a donation to this fund.

Secretariat

The Vereniging Ouders, Kinderen en Kanker (VOKK), the childhood cancer parent organisation in The Netherlands, generously continued the work of the Secretariat for its ninth year. Patty Brouwer and Marianne Naafs-Wilstra are in charge.

Collaboration Programmes

UICC - My Child Matters

Launched jointly by the International Union Against Cancer and Sanofi-aventis in 2005, the My Child Matters campaign is one of the largest initiatives involved in fighting childhood cancer in low and middle income countries. Up to now 39 projects have been launched in 26 countries. Some projects are working together with ICCCPO members. However, the huge inequalities in treatment available in developing countries for children with cancer is still a chasm that needs to be bridged. We hope this project will continue to receive funding.

Executive Committee member Kenneth Dollman was invited onto the My Child Matters steering committee in early 2009.
