ANNUAL REPORT



The board is proud to share the success of the ICCCPO activities and programmes over the past year.

Welcome to our 2007-08 annual report. I would like to start by giving our thanks to Simon Lala for his period as Chair. As the organisation grows he and the board have had to adjust to keep pace with that growth. You will see in this report and as we now develop that continental working will become more important to ICCCPO. As we grow, continental working means that the organisation is large enough to work more locally on the issues most relevant to each member. And we believe this will also make us a stronger organisation, with people becoming involved regionally as well as internationally.

In our strategic review last year we identified some key areas for development. These included ensuring continuity of ICCCPO; developing the culture of ICCCPO, developing membership and regional committees; providing good information; encouraging twinning; advocating the needs at an international level; fundraising and controlling. These are now the key goals of the board and what we do for our membership over the next few years will be aimed at advancing these areas.

The Chair's note was written by Geoff Thaxter prior to his illness. Geoff was diagnosed with brain tumour in May 2008. He passed away peacefully at home on August 19, 2008. We express our heartfelt gratitude to Geoff for his dedication and contribution to ICCCPO, WCCF and children with cancer.



Annual Conference

The 2007 Annual Conference was held in Mumbai, India. More than 180 parents and survivors from around the world enjoyed the informative sessions, networking opportunities and witnessed the exciting advancements India is making in the field of paediatric oncology. The annual conference, which was chaired by ICCCPO board members, Christine Wandzura and Anita Kienesberger, is held at the same time as the International Society of Paediatric Oncology (SIOP) conference and continues to be the most effective venue to exchange information, train group leaders and create opportunities to share and learn from each other. Our sincerest thanks to the Cancer Patients Association of India and especially Shubha Maudgal and Neelima Dalvi, for being such gracious hosts and for arranging an outstanding social programme for both the parents and survivors.

Executive Committee

The board met on two occasions: first in November 2007 Mumbai. The mid-year meeting, in April 2008, was held in South Africa, thus encouraging the tremendous work that is being done in this vast continent.

At the AGA Christine Wandzura from Canada left the board after twelve years. Anders Wollmén from Sweden was elected a new member. Christine will remain actively involved in ICCCPO, like many other former board members.

Membership

The General Assembly held on November 1, 2007, in Mumbai, India, approved eight new members — four full and four associate — from four new countries. This brought our membership to 105 member organizations from 65 countries. There are again a number of new applications up for ratification by the next AGA in Berlin.

Regional Meetings and Programmes

AFRICA

A workshop for delegates from seven African countries was held in Johannesburg in April 2008 in conjunction with the local South African conference of CHOC. Delegates from South Africa, Ghana, Nigeria, Botswana, Cameroon, Malawi and Zimbabwe attended. The draft version of the new ICCCPO Handbook (see under "Information") was used as the basis for the workshop and was very well received.

Both the ICCCPO board and African representatives were present at the CHOC Conference which was extremely successful and well attended.

ASIA

On February 27, 2008 a workshop for parent and survivor groups was held in Muscat, Oman in conjunction with the fifth SIOP Asia Conference. There was good representation from various Asian countries. We anticipate further development of parent initiatives in the Arab world.

EUROPE

ICCCPO and SIOP Europe

ICCCPO and SIOP Europe enjoyed a successful joint meeting on 19 March, 2008. Together with the SIOP Europe President, Professor Kathy Pritchard-Jones and two SIOP Europe staff, 21 ICCCPO delegates from 15 countries enthusiastically exchanged opinions on how to improve the communication between parent groups and paediatric oncology professionals; how to strengthen the joint input in relation to childhood cancer related policy at both national and European levels; and how to improve on the collaboration between ICCCPO and SIOP Europe in the future. This fruitful meeting not only enriched the communication between the umbrella associations (SIOP Europe and ICCCPO) but also concluded with a joint proposal to revise the document on Recommendations for the organisation of a paediatric cancer unit.'

ICCCPO partner in European consortia

ICCCPO is full partner in two European consortia, which are working on innovative treatment for children with cancer: ITCC and CHILDHOPE. ICCCPO was invited to become partner in a third EU sponsored project: the European Paediatric Oncology off-patent medicines Consortium (EPOC).

EURORDIS

Irina Ban and two delegates from our Spanish and French member organisations attended the EURORDIS Summer School for patient advocates in clinical trials and drug development in Barcelona, Spain.

EMEA

Plans are underway to develop a closer relationship with the European Medicines Agency (EMEA), more specifically with the paediatric committee (PDCO) of the EMEA.

LATIN AMERICA

The Latin American ICCCPO conference was organized in conjunction with the SLAOP meeting in Puebla, México. Other conferences where Edith Grynszpancholc represented ICCCPO and gave lectures on different topics were: the St. Jude AHOPCA in the Dominican

Republic, a meeting in Colombia, meetings on the Influence in Public Policies in Paraguay and Brazil and a meeting of the Latin American Network of Hospital teachers in Chile. Visits to parent organizations in México City, Sao Paulo (Brazil), Santiago de Chile, Quito and Guayaquil in Ecuador were arranged.

SOUTH PACIFIC

Over the past two years a review of Child Cancer Services in the Pacific Islands has been undertaken by a team of paediatric oncologists from New Zealand. The goal now is for New Zealand to train doctors and nursing staff from the Islands to a level that all follow ups would be undertaken in the six islands once the initial treatment was administered in New Zealand. This would mean that many more children would have access to treatment rather than just a select few that can afford to fund their own treatment in New Zealand or Australia. As a parent representative, Simon Lala has promoted the benefits of parent groups and helping to set up groups in the islands. This year, we have seen the formation of the Tonga Child Cancer Foundation.

Through my eyes

For the third time Through My Eyes, a Day in the Life of Children with Cancer around the World was held. On February 15, International Childhood Cancer Day, Children with cancer took pictures of their home surroundings to give us a glimpse of how childhood cancer is dealt with in the home. Their photos were exhibited during the SIOP-ICCCPO conference in Mumbai. More than 30 clinics and parent groups participated in the project. The project was coordinated by the Kids Cancer Care Foundation of Alberta. The primary goal of the exhibit was to educate the public about childhood cancer and demonstrate that there are vast differences in treatment and care between developed and developing countries. The ICCCPO and SIOP initiated this project to raise awareness in order to improve the care with children with cancer receive in hospitals around the world.

My Child Matters

My Child Matters has been a highly successful programme organized by UICC with the support of Sanofi Aventis. No other single programme has provided so much support for child cancer programmes in so many countries. ICCCPO has been delighted to be part of this work. Our thanks go to UICC and Sanofi Aventis and to all our colleagues on the My Child Matters board who worked to make this a success.

Information and Communications

Newsletter

The ICCCPO Newsletter 2007 nr. 2 was the last of at least 36 newsletters, which came from the desk of Gerlind Bode in Bonn, Germany. She started this important communication tool immediately after the first international parent group meeting in Hanover, Germany, in 1992, thus fulfilling what ICCCPO is all about: sharing information and experiences. Marianne Naafs also took a step back. From now on Sarah Talbott-Williams from Clic-Sargent Cancer Care for Children in the United Kingdom is responsible for the Newsletter.

Publications

A draft version of a new handbook was written in early 2008 and reviewed by the Executive Committee. A final version should be available for all members by the end of August 2008. The handbook, entitled "Your Group is not Alone", is intended to incorporate the experiences of

existing groups and to provide ideas and advice to people who are starting new groups to support children with cancer, especially in developing nations.

Website

The ICCCPO web site underwent a revamp in mid-2007, to make it easier to use. The number of visitors to the site has been fairly steady for the past 12 months at about 3,500 per month.

Strategic Review

The board met in Scotland last year (March 2007) to review our strategic plan. This is mentioned in the introduction, but key to the review is the desire to grow the organisation's membership further and to introduce regional and continental committees so that work in these groups is relevant to those attending. It is also helpful to develop people working nationally, regionally, and internationally.

Sponsorship

The board extends its gratitude to members who contributed by way of services-in-kind or by giving financial support to ICCCPO, particularly the contributions of CLIC Sargent UK and Barncancerfonden Sweden for the Mumbai conference.

We encourage more sponsorship of ICCCPO. We have managed to secure two supporters for the annual conference and we also hope other organisations might be interested in sponsoring things such as our annual report and our web site. Parents Helping Parents Fund

The Parent Helping Parents Fund (PHPF) remains important to support delegates from less privileged countries to attend the ICCCPO meetings. We are extremely grateful to those members that supported the PHPF and thus made our vision of sharing a reality.

World Child Cancer Foundation (WCCF)

Last year at our annual general assembly, we agreed to launch the World Child Cancer Foundation. The first financial year runs until December 31, 2008. Initial progress has been good. We raised ≤ 574.000 towards our initial goal of $\leq 1,500.000$. A logo and a website were developed (www.worldccf.org).

The WCCF board has approved the funding of two projects and proposals are being presented to WCCF for operation in 2009. It has been decided to recruit a fundraising professional for WCCF to ensure more sustainable sources of funds. Jo Hopkins has started her work as Director of Fundraising on July 15, 2008 in London.

Three key people of ICCCPO are trustees of WCCF thus assuring ICCCPO's ownership of WCCF. They are Geoff Thaxter, current chair of ICCCPO, Simon Lala, immediate past chair of ICCCPO, and Marianne Naafs-Wilstra, past chair of ICCCPO.

Secretariat

The Dutch Parent Organisation (VOKK) has continued to generously fund and undertake the work of the secretariat. Since April 2008 Dr. Patty Brouwer was hired as part-time assistant.

A survey went out to all members to collect data about their activities. A special database has been developed to make the administration easier.
